

Key Points of Report

A Quarterly Report on Full-Time Equivalent State Employees for the Quarter Ending August 31, 2001

February 2002

Overall Conclusion

For fiscal year 2001, the average number of full-time equivalent (FTE) state employees was 271,258. Texas had 265,616 FTEs for the quarter ending August 31, 2001, based on reports submitted by 212 agencies and institutions of higher education. These FTEs represented 243,522 full-time and 50,827 parttime employees. Agencies and institutions of higher education also reported using temporary and contract workers to perform work equal to 1,251.51 FTEs as of the last working day of the quarter. The overall statewide managementto-staff ratio was 1 manager/supervisor to 13.22 staff members.

Key Facts and Findings

- From the third quarter to the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001 the overall number of FTEs decreased by 3.03 percent.
- From the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2000 to the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001 the overall number of FTEs increased by 0.49 percent.
- The overall number of FTEs increased by 1.45 percent between fiscal years 1996 and 2001.
- From fiscal year 1991 to fiscal year 2001, the number of FTEs throughout the state increased by more than 18 percent (41,242 FTEs). Most of this growth occurred between fiscal years 1990 and 1995 at public safety and criminal justice agencies and higher education institutions.
- Four agencies and 35 institutions of higher education exceeded their FTE caps by more than 1 FTE during the fourth quarter.

Report Overview

For fiscal year 2001, the average number of full-time equivalent (FTE) state employees was 271,258. Texas had 265,616 FTEs for the quarter ending August 31, 2001, based on reports from 212 agencies and institutions of higher education. These FTEs represented 243,522 full-time and 50,827 part-time employees. Agencies and institutions of higher education also reported using 18,702 contractors and temporary workers equal to 1,251.51 FTEs as of the last working day of the quarter.

This report is based on self-reported data from state agencies and institutions of higher education. The State Auditor's Office did not independently verify the data.

Changes in State Employment Over Time

The number of FTEs decreased by 3.03 percent from the third quarter of fiscal year 2001 to the fourth quarter. The State's overall employment increased only slightly from the fourth quarter of 2000 to the fourth quarter of 2001. Since 1996, overall employment increased by 1.45 percent, or roughly 3,801 FTEs.

Changes From the Previous Quarter

The overall number of FTEs decreased by 3.03 percent from the third quarter to the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001. The number of FTEs for state agencies increased by 0.41 percent, and the number of FTEs for institutions of higher education decreased by 7.08 percent (see Table 1).

Table 1

Nine entities increased by more than 100 FTEs during the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001. The top five were:

- The Department of Transportation by 850.90 FTEs.
- The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center by 474.14 FTEs.
- The University of Texas Southwest Medical Center at Dallas by 376 FTEs.
- The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston by 366.97 FTEs.
- The Texas Agricultural Experiment Station (A&M) by 315.48 FTEs.

Twenty-seven agencies and institutions of higher education decreased by at least 100 FTEs. The state agencies with the largest decreases were:

- The Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation by 188.43 FTEs.
- The Department of Criminal Justice by 497.48 FTEs.
- The House of Representatives by 184.63 FTEs.

Twenty-four institutions of higher education decreased by at least 100 FTEs. The top two were:

- The University of Texas at Austin by 1,663.88 FTEs.
- Texas A&M University by 1,493.85 FTEs.

Changes From the Fourth Quarter of Fiscal Year 2001

When comparing fiscal years 2000 and 2001, the number of FTEs remained nearly constant. The State's overall employment increased by 1,292.95 FTEs (0.49 percent) from the fourth quarter of 2000 to the fourth quarter of 2001 (see Table 2).

Changes Over the Past Five Years

Between fiscal years 1996 and 2001 the number of FTEs increased by 1.45 percent (see Table 3).

Public safety and criminal justice agencies increased their FTEs by 4.21 percent:

- The Texas Youth Commission increased by 2,032.39 FTEs.
- The Department of Public Safety increased by 419.52 FTEs.
- The Department of Criminal Justice decreased by 411.10 FTEs.


Higher education institutions increased their FTEs by 10.51 percent:

- The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center increased by 3,632.12 FTEs.
- The University of Texas Southwest Medical Center increased by 931.64 FTEs.
- The Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center increased by 700.70 FTEs.
- Texas Agricultural Experiment Station (A&M) increased by 638.83 FTEs.
- Southwest Texas State University increased by 607.20 FTEs.

Overall, health and human service agencies decreased their FTEs by 14.90 percent:

- The Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation decreased by 7,758.15 FTEs.
- The Department of Human Services decreased by 1470.24 FTEs.
- The Department of Protective and Regulatory Services increased by 671.91 FTEs.
- The Department of Health decreased by 217.09 FTEs.


Distribution of State Employees During the Last Quarter of Fiscal Year 2001



State agencies employed 56 percent of all state employees; the remaining 44 percent worked for institutions of higher education. Among state agencies, public safety and

criminal justice agencies and health and human service agencies employed the majority of FTEs. Fifteen large state agencies employed 89 percent of state agency employees, and two large universities employed 74 percent of higher education employees.

A majority, more than 65 percent, of state agency employees worked in public safety and criminal justice or in health and human services.









Fifteen large state agencies, each with over 1,000 FTEs, employed 89 percent of state agency FTEs. Large state agencies accounted for only 10 percent of total agencies.

Thirty-seven agencies reported FTE counts between 100 and 1,000 for the fourth employed less than 10 percent of all state agency employees.


More than 60 percent of all state agencies had fewer than 100 FTEs. Ninety-three state agencies reported FTE counts of fewer than 100 in the fourth quarter. These small agencies represented 64 percent of all agencies, yet employed less than 2 percent of all state agency employees.



Institutions of Higher Education


Almost 45 percent of higher education employees are paid with funds that are not appropriated by the State. Non-appropriated funds are used to pay 44 percent of FTEs at higher education institutions.


Thirty-nine percent of higher education FTEs are employed at health-related institutions. The remaining 61 percent work for academic and researchrelated institutions.

Changes in State Employment By General Appropriations Act Article Since 1991

The number of FTEs throughout the state increased by over 18.38 percent (41,242 FTEs) between fiscal years 1991 and 2001.

Among State Agencies, Public Safety and Criminal Justice Agencies Added the Most FTEs

The total number of FTEs at public safety and criminal justice agencies increased by 21,227 FTEs between fiscal years 1991 and 2001 (see Figure 8). This increase is the




largest among state agencies and is second only to institutions of higher education.

During the same 10-year period, the number of FTEs at health and human services agencies decreased by 5,463 FTEs.

FTE totals for business and economic development agencies remained relatively stable throughout the 1990s. Overall FTE

counts decreased by 1,598 since 1991, primarily due to staff reductions at the Texas Workforce Commission as the agency supported creation of local Workforce Development Boards.


Agencies Categorized Under Articles With Fewer Than 10,000 FTEs Have Grown Since 1991

General government and natural resources agencies experienced significant growth between fiscal years 1991 and 2001 (see Figure 9). General government agencies added 1,271 FTEs, and natural resources agencies added 1,425 FTEs. Natural resources agencies decreased their overall FTE counts between 1995 and 2001.

Judiciary and legislative agencies also increased the total number of FTEs since 1991: judiciary agencies by 271 and legislative agencies by 45.

Regulatory and public education agencies decreased their total number of FTEs over the same time period: regulatory decreased by 407 and public education decreased by 211.

The Number of FTEs in Institutions of Higher Education Increased Significantly Between Fiscal Years 1991 and 2001



The number of higher education institution FTEs increased by 24,683 since 1991. The

majority of this increase (nearly 15,000 FTEs) was in positions paid from funds other than those appropriated by the Texas Legislature (prior to 1998, this number represented the number of FTEs paid from funds outside of the State Treasury).

Contractors and Consultants at State Entities

Agencies and institutions of higher education reported using 18,702 contractors and consultants as of the last day of the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001. Almost half of the state's contractors and consultants worked for the Department of Transportation. Two agencies and 5 higher education institutions employed more than 400 contractors or consultants during the quarter (see Table 4).

Temporary or Contract Workers at State Entities

Thirty-two agencies and 13 institutions of higher education used temporary or contractor workers equal to 1251.51 FTEs for more than half of the work days of the previous 12 months (see Table 5).

For reporting purposes, temporary or contract workers include those under contract to fill specific positions customarily filled by state employees. Outsourced functions and work done by consultants are excluded from these requirements. As Table 5 shows, for the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001, 32 agencies and 13 institutions of higher education reported a total of 1251.51 FTEs for temporary or contract workers working more than half of the workdays in the previous 12 months.

The 76th Legislature added new provisions to FTE reporting requirements. These provisions allow the Legislature to gather information on the use of temporary or contract workers for customary state business and on the effect this practice has on state employment levels. As of the first quarter of fiscal year 2000, state agencies and institutions of higher education were required to report hours worked during the reporting quarter by temporary or contract workers who worked for more than half of the workdays in the previous 12 months and were paid from appropriated funds. Any such hours worked count toward the entity's FTE cap.

The total number of state contract workers that met the above requirements and that were reported for each quarter of fiscal year 2001 were as follows: 893.82 in the first

quarter, 1011.01 in the second quarter, 1149.89 in the third quarter, and 1251.51 in the fourth quarter.

Agencies and Universities That Exceeded Legislatively Mandated FTE Caps

Five agencies exceeded their quarterly FTE caps, set by the Legislature, without approval from the Legislative Budget Board and the Office of the Governor (see Table 6 for individual agency explanations).

Management-to-Staff Ratios at State Entities

The overall statewide management-to-staff ratio was 1 manager/supervisor to 13.22 staff members, slightly higher than the 1:11 ratio the State would like to achieve (see Table 8).

At this time, the State has no legislative mandate to achieve a specific managementto-staff ratio. However, each agency is required to develop procedures for achieving a management-to-staff ratio of 1 manager to 11 staff members. Forty-four percent of all state agencies and higher education institutions achieved the desired ratio of 1 manager/supervisor for every 11 non-supervisory staff members. Twenty-three agencies and forty-two institutions of higher education reported a 1:11 ratio or higher.

Very small agencies often have a ratio much lower than the desired 1:11 ratio; therefore, the State Auditor's Office groups and reports on these agencies separately. Thirteen of the 100 agencies and institutions (13 percent) with fewer than 100 employees met the goal of a 1:11 ratio.

Although the average management-to-staff ratio for agencies and institutions with more than 100 employees was approximately 1:13, the Department of Criminal Justice, with over 35,000 FTEs, reported a ratio of 1:73, which affects the statewide average significantly. Other agencies and higher education institutions with high management-to-staff ratios include: the Wildlife Damage Management Service with

1:86.5, the University of North Texas with 1:36.9, the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio with 1:36.8, the University of Houston with 1:32, and the University of Texas Pan America with 1:31.6.

The significant differences in management-to-staff ratios between various agencies do not necessarily mean one agency is better managed than another. Agency size, organizational function and mission, and managerial strategy can affect what constitutes a "reasonable" span of control for any agency.

Appendix 1: Objective, Scope, and Methodology

Objective

The objective of this report is to provide the Legislature and the public with information on the number of state employees and the number of consultants and contract workers that perform services for state government. This report was prepared in accordance with Government Code, Chapter 2052, Subchapter B.

Scope

The report's scope encompasses information submitted to the State Auditor's Office by 212 agencies and institutions of higher education. The information in this report is based on self-reported data from these agencies and institutions. The State Auditor's Office did not independently verify the accuracy of this reported information.

Methodology

The methodology employed to analyze the data in this report included comparing data for the fourth quarter of fiscal year 2001 to (previously submitted) data for the third quarter of fiscal year 2001 and to fourth quarter data from the previous 10 years.

Report Variances

Agency and higher educational institution variances are depicted in Tables 1 through 3 of this report, but an overall statewide variance is not computed, as selected agencies are not bound by FTE caps. The Texas State Museum, the Panhandle Plains Historical Museum, the State Bar of Texas, the Board of Law Examiners, and all Article X agencies are reported in FTE totals but are not assigned FTE caps in the General Appropriations Act.

FTE Caps

- FTE caps were modified only if there were rider adjustments in the General Appropriations Act or if both the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office granted an exception.
- FTE caps for agencies are based only on FTEs paid from state appropriated funds.
- The FTE cap for West Texas A&M University (Agency No. 757) provides an overall FTE cap for both the university and the Panhandle Plains Historical Museum (Agency No. 039). The museum does not have an FTE cap listed in the General Appropriations Act.
- The 76th Legislature did not assign FTE caps for the Texas State Museum, the State Bar of Texas, the Board of Law Examiners, or any Article X agencies.

- The State Auditor's Office and the Legislative Budget Board agree that the Teacher Retirement System should report its FTEs as "Appropriated" and "All Other Funds" as allowed for higher education institutions.
- This report combines the number of FTEs and the FTE caps for the Office of the Governor and the Trustees Program, as appropriations and FTEs may be transferred between these two programs.

Non-Standard Work Week FTE Calculations

Agencies with a significant percentage of employees who work non-standard work weeks are allowed to use one of three methods for calculating FTEs. Each agency is required to continue using the chosen method for the entire fiscal year. The options are listed below:

Description of Data Reported for Table I:

- (1) FTE Cap: The maximum number of FTEs allowed by the Legislature, as designated in the General Appropriations Act (Act). "-----" indicates that an FTE Cap for this agency and period was not specifically designated by the Act, or that the agency had an Annual FTE Cap. For agencies with an Annual FTE Cap, the comparison to FTEs will be performed only during the 4th Quarter using an Annual Average of the FTEs reported during the fiscal year.
- (2) Total FTEs: The total hours paid for all state employees during the quarter, whether full-time or part-time, including student or seasonal employees, <u>divided by</u> the total hours during the quarter that one regular full-time state employee would be paid for. Paid hours <u>include</u> actual hours worked plus any paid leave taken, but specifically <u>exclude</u> any FLSA overtime hours worked or paid, FLSA overtime or state compensatory hours accrued and banked, and FLSA overtime or annual leave lump-sum payments made when an employee terminates. Beginning in FY 2000, Total FTEs also include those FTEs from contractors hired to fill specific positions customarily filled by state employees during the quarter.
- (3) Appropriated Funds: The number of FTEs paid from monies appropriated by the General Appropriations Act or another Act of the Texas Legislature that makes appropriations.
- (4) All Other Funds: The number of FTEs paid from any other monies (other than appropriated funds) that are at the disposal of the agency or institution, including institutional funds or grant monies that are not appropriated.
- (5) **Contractor FTEs:** The number of hours paid <u>during the quarter</u> to contract or temporary workers who filled a position for more than half the work days of the year preceding the final day of the reporting period. Only hours worked after the half-year limitation is exceeded count for these purposes. Agencies and institutions began reporting this information during the first quarter of Fiscal Year 2000.
- (6) FTE Variance: The difference in FTEs between the designated FTE Cap and the Total FTEs reported. This figure represents the number of FTEs by which the FTE Cap is exceeded or unmet.
- (7) Full-Time Employees: The number of employees (headcount) scheduled to work the number of hours that represent regular full-time employment (usually 40 hours per week) in accordance with Texas Government Code, Chapter 658. This figure represents the number of full-time employees in a paid leave, holiday, or compensatory time taken status, and students, temporary, or seasonal employees who are employed to work the number of hours that represents full-time employment on the last working day of the quarter.
- (8) Part-Time Employees: The number of employees (headcount) scheduled to work less than the number of hours that represent regular full-time employment (usually 40 hours per week) in accordance with Texas Government Code, Chapter 658. This figure represents the number of part-time employees in a paid leave, holiday, or compensatory time taken status, and students, temporary, or seasonal employees who are employed to work the number of hours that represents part-time employment on the last working day of the quarter.

- 555 Employment of short term and student workers to meet increased agricultural seasonal demand and employment of summmer interns to increase access in hiring for future position vacancies.
- 709 Changes due to normal hiring and attrition.
- 713 FTEs are lower because fourth quarter covers summer months less students taking classes and working on campus and fewer faculty teaching. FTEs exceed the cap because of the addition of a new center in Killeen, Texas request to exceed the cap was submitted.
- 714 Decrease from previous quarter is due to the fourth quarter being the Summer School reporting period. Summer School faculty FTE are less than regular long semester faculty FTE counts.
- 718 Number of FTE is reduced in the summer when the number of students is less than the spring enrollment.
- 719 TSTC previously submitted requests in August and October 1999, July 2000 and July 2001 to exceed the FTE cap due to increased enrollment. TSTC has not received a response to these requests.

This represents a new criminal justice faculty position, required for a master's program in criminal justice, two new FTEs to support the new Integrated Pest Management Entomology program and 1.75 new FTEs to support the new Agribusiness Accelerator/Incubator. The IPM Entomology program and the Agribusiness Accelerator/Incubator are funded with special item appropriations.
- 760 FTE declined this quarter due to the typical decrease in summer session activity. A request to exceed the cap has been submitted. Our four-quarter average for FY 2001 appropriated funds is 739.91.
