

A Report on Health and Human Services Commission Contracts

March 23, 2020

Members of the Legislative Audit Committee:

Texas Government Code, Section 321.013(k), requires that, in devising its audit plan, the State Auditor's Office shall consider performing audits of Health and Human Services Commission (Commission) contracts that exceed \$100 million in annual value, including contracts between the Commission and managed care organizations. Pursuant to that requirement, the State Auditor's Office used unaudited information from the Commission's System of Contract Operation and Reporting (SCOR) to compile a list of each Commission contract with a total value exceeding \$100 million.

The State Auditor's Office identified 98 contracts with a total value exceeding \$100 million. Those contracts included:

- Forty-seven contracts for managed care services.
- Twenty-five long-term care contracts that transitioned from the Department of Aging and Disability Services to the Commission during fiscal year 2017.
- Ten contracts related to various aspects of operating Medicaid, Children's Health Insurance, Medical Transportation, and administrative programs; and other medical/enrollment services.
- Six interlocal contracts related to mental health services.
- Six contracts related to information technology.
- Four construction contracts.

According to information from SCOR, as of January 13, 2020, expenditures for those 98 contracts totaled approximately \$149.5 billion.

Objective, Scope, and Methodology

The objective of this project was to identify and analyze Commission contracts exceeding \$100 million in total value, including all contracts with managed care organizations, to meet the requirements in Texas Government Code, Section 321.013(k).

The project scope included Commission contracts that were active between September 1, 2018, and November 30, 2019, and had a total value exceeding \$100 million as of January 13, 2020.

This project was not an audit. The project relied on self-reported Commission information regarding contracts and their associated expenditures. That information was not subject to the tests and confirmations that would be performed in an audit. However, the information in this report was subject to certain quality control procedures to help ensure accuracy. The following members of the State Auditor's staff performed the project:

Summary of Health and Human Services Commission Contracts

Table 1 lists each Health and Human Services Commission (Commission) contract with a total value exceeding \$100 million. To determine a contract's total value, the State Auditor's Office considered both the award values and expenditures associated with those contracts.

The Commission generated this unaudited information from its System of Contract Operation and Reporting (SCOR) as of January 13, 2020. For the purposes of this project, SCOR was the most complete repository of Commission contract data, including data on the award values and expenditures associated with those contracts. Auditors did not verify the accuracy of the contract data in SCOR.
